ACTION REQUIRED! IMPORTANT NEWS From SBCSC HR!

"All employees are asked to submit proof of vaccination by February 1, 2022."

SBCSC Employees,

Although opponents of the rule have appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court asking it to block the mandate, a decision isn't expected for at least a few weeks. Therefore, South Bend Schools must comply with the vaccination and testing mandate unless (and until) there is federal intervention.

Therefore, we have no option but to begin collecting information about your vaccination status. Of course implementation will only occur if a future stay is unsuccessful.

All employees are asked to submit proof of vaccination by February 1, 2022. This can easily be done by uploading a pdf of your vaccination card via Employee Payroll Access (link). Note that booster shots may be required to be considered fully vaccinated if it's been more than six months since your last vaccination. So if you've already uploaded your vaccination card but it didn't include your booster shot, you will need to upload the updated card again.

If you are unvaccinated and choose to stay unvaccinated, please begin planning for the weekly required test. In the coming weeks, we will have more information about what proof of testing you will need to provide and how to do so. We are also looking into resources to support employee testing.

Vaccination is our best protection, and will eliminate the requirement of weekly testing. Working with the health department and other health care providers, we will continue to provide convenient, easy options for our employees and students to receive vaccinations.

Reminder - ENL Courses at Holy Cross College

ENL Course Offerings:

Holy Cross College will be providing a 3-cu ENL course for certified teachers (certified prior to September, 2019) seeking EL Teacher-of-Record status. As a reminder, the IDOE is offering a special **Teacher-of-Record Pathway** through September of 2022 to assist schools in meeting the directive requiring accountability for English Learners.

In addition, Holy Cross College continues to offer the **ENL Certification Program for Professionals.** The Holy Cross College Certification Program is a 4-course, 14-cu program which can be completed in 2-3 semesters, depending on the start date (fall or spring). Attached is a document that provides information about both the stand-alone course and the full Certification Program.

Holy Cross is already enrolling for their Spring Semester. Also, the Holy Cross Education Program continues to expand with Transition-to-Teaching, BA-Completion, and Dual-Enrollment tracks.

Please share this information regarding the courses with your staff as soon as possible so that they might have time to consider these options.


