NEW- -Guidance Office SAT Testing at Washington HS. Preparing for the upcoming Test:

Preparing for the Upcoming SAT: Faculty Information.

School Day SAT will be Wednesday, March 2nd. The following is pertinent information for that day:

- Only juniors will attend in person on March 2nd
- All other students (grades 9,10,12) will participate in asynchronous e-learning
- All CTE students will report to their home school on the morning of March 2nd instead of their CTE program. Due to the length of the test, CTE students will not attend any afternoon CTE programs on test day. Central Office staff will work with transportation to arrange any needed changes.
- This is a digital test, therefore, student devices will need to ready and charges and any extra Chromebooks will be ready to distribute if needed
- The test is 3 hours and 45 minutes
- We are required to have 95% participation as this is a state mandate
- **Preadministration** will be done in English 11 classes prior to the actual test day
- Students will test, go to lunch and then return to the same classroom they tested in for the remainder of the day
- All students will go to C lunch which begins at 12:30
- Afternoon coverage begins at 1 pm
- Staff have been assigned as Proctors, Room Monitors, Hall Monitors and Afternoon relief (see attached spreadsheet)

- The entire staff must complete the training no later than Wednesday, February 23rd (links included)...You will train to be a proctors, hall and room monitors regardless of your assignment
- All staff will need to create a College Board Professional Account in order to complete the required proctor training...you have to create the account as the user as I cannot create it for you
- Some teachers may already have an account (AP teachers, SAT administrators, etc.)
- After completion of the proctor, hall and room monitor training, please upload the proctor training certificate (if you need assistance, please contact Mrs. Kasznia) and complete the google form (attached)
- When logging in or creating an account on College Board you will need the following following



NEW- - UPDATED COVID Cases Reporting for SBCSC

Yesterday, the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) released updated COVID-19 quarantine guidance for schools that become effective on Wednesday, February 23.

We have included a few of the highlights from this update in the following statements:

- Schools will no longer be required to conduct contact tracing or report positive cases to IDOH.
- Schools no longer will need to quarantine students and staff who are exposed to a positive COVID-19 case, regardless of vaccination status or whether the school requires masks.
- Individuals who test positive for COVID-19 should isolate for five days and may return on day six if they have been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication as long as symptoms are improving, according to guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Individuals should wear a mask through day10 whenever they are around others inside their homes or in public.

As a result of these changes, South Bend Schools will no longer identify close contacts and will not quarantine students or staff who are exposed to a positive COVID-19 case, regardless of vaccination status.

We still require students and staff who become positive to notify their school or the benefits department, as our district is expected to assist local health departments with notification in the event of an outbreak or cluster.

Additionally, the current mask mandate in our schools will continue under further notice. Please note that masks are still required on school buses, as this is a federal requirement established by the Department of Transportation.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, <u>COVID-19 vaccines</u> have been studied by experts and are safe, effective, and highly successful in preventing severe illness and death.

- The Pfizer vaccine is approved and available for anyone age 5 and older. The Moderna and Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) vaccines are approved and available for anyone age 18 and older.
- <u>*OurShot.IN.gov*</u> has more information and can help you find a vaccination site near you.

We will continue to communicate with our school community when we receive additional information or guidance from state or local health departments. Your cooperation and teamwork in keeping students and staff safe have been recognized and appreciated during this unprecedented time.

NEW- - COVID Vaccine Percentages for Washington

The COVID-19 vaccination percentage we have for Washington High School - it's 33.86%, compared to **37%** overall in the corporation.

This is the percentage of employees working in your building who have received the vaccine and uploaded a copy of their card to PowerSchool.

We are confident more people have received the vaccine but have not yet uploaded a copy of their card.

Having accurate information is helpful as we prepare for policy changes related to masks and social distance.

While vaccination is not required (nor are people required to submit proof) we encourage you to remind those who have been vaccinated to upload a copy of their card, and assure them of the confidentiality of this information.

To upload your vaccination status/card, please go to available forms, add as an e-form for yourself and then upload your vaccination card.


Social Studies Dept Celebrates BHM- - ESCAPE ROOM Challenge!
